Welcome to the 2011 Show Season!

To make this year even better than last we made a few changes to the show bill. We added a hunter-hack class, combined the 14-15 and 16-18 Gymkhana age groups to make them more competitive, eliminated the not so popular sweepstakes equitation classes and now Novice Western Riders of all ages will have **3** chances to win a \$100 gift certificate to Hobby Horse.

Membership prices are the same as 2010, but now include a pair of laminated numbers for each member for use at every show, and the ability to avoid long lines at the booth by pre-entering for classes. Class entry forms and fees can be mailed, handed in at the previous show or e-mailed using the fillable entry form on the website (checks must be dropped at the booth, before your first class). Individual class fees are unchanged, but, there are now more ride all day options. You can show in halter, ride all the pleasure classes and trail for \$30, or ride all the Gymkhana classes and trail for \$25. Or you can show halter, pleasure, gymkhana and trail for \$50.

In 2010 we were able to offer some great prizes and would love to be able to offer even better prizes this year. To do this we need SPONSORS. Sponsoring a class at SPUR is the advertising bargain of the century. For \$50 the Sponsor's Business card and a link to their website appear on our website and end of year Banquet program, their name is announced at every show and is placed on the banner displayed at all 5 shows. Ask everyone you do business with if they would like to sponsor SPUR. Talk to your farrier, vet, dentist, massage therapist, hay guy, feed store, tack store, trainer, barn manager, lumber store, farmer, mechanic, truck store, gas stations, well you get the picture!
